

Sports Premium Provision Map 2016 – 17

The PE and Sports Premium is designed to help schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The funding for Minerva Primary Academy in 2016/17 is £9,345 (Pupil Voice is based on a sample of 45 children across Years 1-6)

After School Sports Clubs

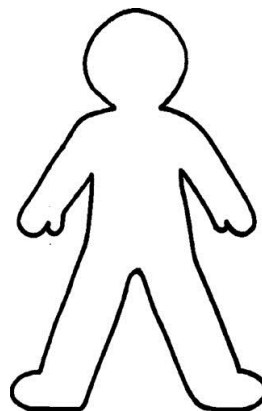
Overview: After school sports clubs are provided every day of the week and are funded by the PE and Sports Premium. These are run by Premier Sports.

Cost: £9,500

Aim/Outcome: To enable all pupils to participate in after school sport activities.

IMPACT

11 different clubs were available over the year including fencing, archery, gymnastics, athletics and basketball. 266 places were taken up by pupils in Years 1 to 6. From pupil voice, 82% strongly agreed with the statement "Did you enjoy the after-school sports clubs?". 87% said that they had learnt several new sports skills.



CLF Festival of Games

Overview: CLF support of sports coach

Transport for Competitions

Cost: £1,000

Aim/Outcome: Opportunities for pupils to take part in organised sports competitions with other schools

IMPACT

Groups of Key Stage 2 children took part in competitions with other schools in football, hockey, basketball and netball. 82% of pupils asked said that they grew in confidence, 84% said that they had improved their ability to work as a team.

Physical Activity weekly sessions

Overview: To promote healthy living to all pupils

Cost: £2660

Aim/Outcome: To give all pupils opportunity to participate in various sports

IMPACT

All children in years 1-6 took part in a term of fitness and agility assessments. This has formed the baseline and development areas for school PE next year.

Sports Day

Overview: Annual sports day facilitated by Premier Sports
Cost: £300

Aim/Outcome: For all pupils to experience structured activities. To get involved, stay active and gain confidence in their sporting abilities

IMPACT

All children took part in a variety of activities on sports day. It was well attended by parents and carers. Feedback from parents was positive.

Professional Development

Overview: To provide opportunities for class teachers to observe and teach alongside trained sports professionals

Cost: included in Physical Activity sessions

Aim/Outcome: For teachers to gain greater confidence, experience and PE teaching skills that they can apply to future lessons

IMPACT

100% of teachers in years 1 -6 agree that their confidence in teaching PE has increased and that they have learnt new skills. All teachers have found the professional development valuable.

Sports Apprentice

Overview: To employ apprentice to work with all pupils

Cost: £7000

Aim/Outcome: To provide a sports coach for all pupils

IMPACT

As the Sports Apprentice worked in class as well, she was able to support children to bring skills learnt through sport into the classroom. 87% of children said that sport had increased their resilience for learning and 80% of children said they had increased their understanding of the need for rules.
