The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Rationale:

At Minerva Primary Academy we fully support the agenda which fuels the allocation of Sports Premium money, where it is promoted for all children to have access to high quality PE.

We wish to aim to ensure that PE and school sport are embedded within wider school life at Minerva.

Every child deserves to achieve of the best they can be and to have equality of opportunity regardless of what their parents or carers can access.

We can support children in the provision we provide.

We very much also believe in the importance of giving children experiences that might be outside of their current life experiences.

Through sport we can provide experiences that are 'aspiration-linked' in terms of widening opportunities and in enabling children to be able to access further possibilities in their futures.

We believe in:

- Widening children's experiences beyond their home experiences and giving choices;
- Supporting the 'whole' child with a healthy attitude towards life and overall wellbeing;
- Encouraging a healthy competitive approach in terms of team sports and meeting personal bests;

The breakdown of spending of our Sports Premium

- Sports Funding runs from September to August.
- The 2014/15 Sports Funding for Minerva Primary Academy totals **£9,035**
- The Sports Funding for 2014/15 is planned to be spent in the following way:

The details of our spending of our Primary school PE and sport funding linked to proposed and actual impact

1. After school Sports Clubs

After school sports clubs are provided every day of the week and are funded by the Primary school PE and sport funding. All pupils have an opportunity to take part in at least one club.

Proposed Impact: To support and involve all children in sports afterschool but also with an emphasis on the least active.

How impact will be measured in July 2015:

2. CLF School Sports Co-ordinator

Proposed Impact:

Provision of opportunities for Pupils to take part in organized sports competitions with other schools in the CLF federation and outside.

Provision of coaching for pupils in a variety of sports within the curriculum.

Provision of opportunities for children to showcase their talents at sporting events.

Provides the link between our school and competitions that are available ensuring that Minerva is signed up and able to access competitions.

Transport to events and competitions.

How impact will be measured in July 2015:

- *The number of opportunities to take part in sporting events across the CLF and outside of it*

3. Professional development opportunities for teachers in sport – Premier Sports Coaches in school

Opportunity for class teachers to observe and teach alongside trained sports professionals in order to gain greater confidence, experience and PE teaching skills that they can then apply into future lessons. Opportunities for teachers to attend relevant courses regarding sport provision.

On a date to be confirmed, premier sports will come in to Minerva to host a sports day alongside the teachers.

4. Membership to Bristol and South Gloucester School's Football Association – League and Coronation Cup

Opportunities for children to take part in competitive football within a league against neighbouring primary schools, helping to promote the sport in the local area. The Coronation Cup is the oldest school's football competition in the Bristol area. It again promotes competitive football, although this time against schools from the entire Bristol area as well as providing the opportunity for children to compete in this prestigious competition.
